Parkway Properties is pleased to announce that Rod Moorhead of Oxford has been commissioned to create a sculpture for the plaza that will grace the grand entrance to The Pinnacle at Jackson Place. The piece, entitled *Storytellers*, is comprised of three separate 10-foot sculptures of limestone carved in the likeness of great Mississippi storytellers. Mr. Moorhead's proposal was selected from among ten proposals submitted by artists from across the Southeast depicting the rich cultural history of Mississippi. The *Storytellers* installation is set to coincide with the opening of The Pinnacle in late fall 2008.

Mr. Moorhead's *Storytellers* is sure to follow in the footsteps of his previous work and become a centerpiece of Downtown Jackson. Native Mississippians will recognize his name from multiple projects around the state such as *St. Francis* at St. Francis of Assisi Catholic Church in Madison, *Concerto* at the University of Mississippi's Ford Center for the Performing Arts and the *James Meredith* Civil Rights Memorial at the University of Mississippi.

Parkway Properties CEO Steve Rogers said of the selection, "We are fortunate to have so many talented artists in Mississippi. Mr. Moorhead's work was selected due to the exemplary interpretation and passion for what we are seeking to accomplish. We hope that the Pinnacle's addition to our city's artistic and cultural landscape will be emulated by others, making downtown a destination place for all seeking enjoyment and appreciation of the arts."
